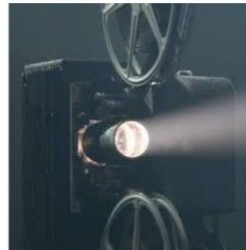
There is a very important Chinook Concert Band rehearsal tomorrow, all concert Band Students must be at Flex Band today!!!

Off-Campus Education has an exciting summer opportunity for students interested in the trades.
The City of Lethbridge will be offering six Registered Apprenticeship Program positions for students this summer.
-1 student to work in the plumbing department
-1 student to work in the electrical department
-2 students in the heavy equipment mechanic shop (fleet services)
-1 student to work in their carpentry department
And possibly one student to work in their traffic light department
Fortis Alberta will place one Registered Apprenticeship Program student to work as a Power Line Technician this summer.
All of these positions are competitive. Students will need to complete an application form, submit a resume, cover letter and a teacher reference. Students must be in good standing with their schools and meet the high school prerequisite classes required to apprentice in the corresponding trade.
