Scholarships

Alexander Rutherford High School Achievement Scholarship – New Online Application

Student Aid Alberta is making applying for the Alexander Rutherford Scholarship easier and more accessible for students!

- Students will be able to apply online in July 2018. The online application will be available on the Student Aid Alberta website through the Students Finance Systems (SFS). Students who have applied to their post-secondary institution through ApplyAlberta will already have an account.
- Purpose: to recognize and reward academic achievement at the senior high school level and to encourage students to pursue post-secondary studies.
- **Value:** Up to \$2500
- **Eligibility:** Apply once your final official high school transcript marks are available and when you are enrolled in full-time post-secondary studies. Anyone with averages of 75% or higher in any of Grade 10, 11, and 12 will receive the scholarship. Make sure you apply!

U of L Grade 11 Merit Award
June 30 – Application Deadline

Grade 11 students planning to enter the U of L from high school, the Grade 11 Merit Award is available to you: Value: \$500 or \$800; 75%-79.9% will receive \$500 and 80% or above will receive \$800.

Separate scholarship application is required by June 30.

RAP/CTS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Deadline: June 30, 2018

Value: \$1000.00

To recognize the accomplishments of Alberta high school students participating in the Registered Apprenticeship Program or who have completed a Career and Technologies Studies apprenticeship pathway and to encourage students to continue their apprenticeship training after completing high school.

To be eligible for a RAP Scholarship you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, and a resident of Alberta as defined by Student Aid Alberta
- Have completed the requirements for a high school diploma in June or earlier
- Be registered as an Alberta apprentice in a trade while still attending high school
- Be continuing in an approved regular apprenticeship program
- Have NOT been awarded a RAP/CTS scholarship previously

- Have at least one period of technical training remaining

To be eligible for a CTS Scholarship you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, and a resident of Alberta as defined by Student Aid Alberta
- Be a registered Alberta apprentice or plan to register within 12 months
- Have completed the requirements for high school graduation in June or earlier
- Have completed one of the technical training remaining
- Have NOT been awarded a RAP/CTS Scholarship previously; and
- A certified copy of your Record of Courses Completed form provided by your supervising teacher must support your application. This form must be completed and signed by your teacher, principal, journeyman instructor and AIT office.
