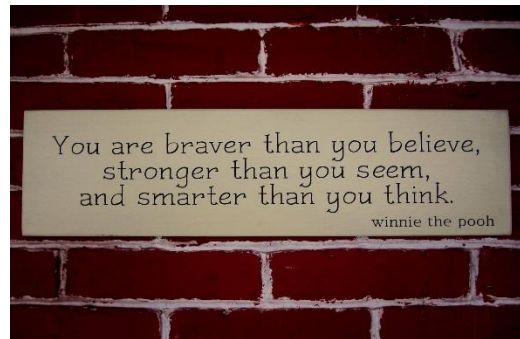

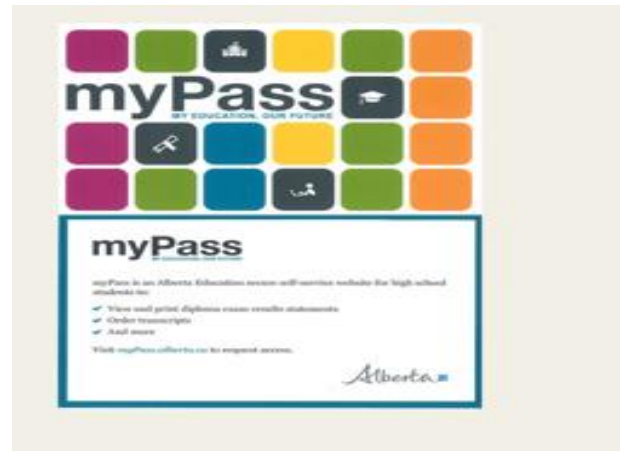

Work Experience



Earn money and high school credits at the same time! Yes, students can hold a **part-time job** or **volunteer** to earn work experience credits. These credits can be applied towards your high school diploma. Students taking work experience 15, 25, 35 can earn a total of 15 credits towards their high school diploma.

Registered apprenticeship Program



What is the Registered apprenticeship Program (RAP)?

“The Trades offer good training, lots of opportunities and job security. The RAP program is a good way for high school students to see what’s out there and get some work experience in a trade of their choice. If you would like to start a real job earning real money, the RAP program is a great first step toward a career. While going to high school, a RAP student earns hours of on-the-job training as credit toward both an apprenticeship program and a high school diploma credential.” Students earn apprenticeship hours, wages and up to 40 RAP credits towards their high school diploma.
