### EPIC Day - Exploring Possible Industries & Careers – For Grade 11- 12 Students - Wednesday, February 7, 2018 at Exhibition Park

2018 is seeing the addition of another career sector - STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)! An exciting addition to our EPIC Day! What students can expect from the day:

- Students can be registered in one of four sectors - Agriculture, Health, STEM or Trades
- They will meet hosts working in that specific industry during the morning - students can start their own network of contacts.
- They will participate in interactive displays - rather than just talking to hosts, students will get to experience a small part of the job and gain a greater insight into what the occupation involves.
- They will learn what it takes to work in that specific industry, including the highlights/lowlights of the job.

#### First Choice Savings And Credit Union – Gerry Jensen Memorial Scholarship

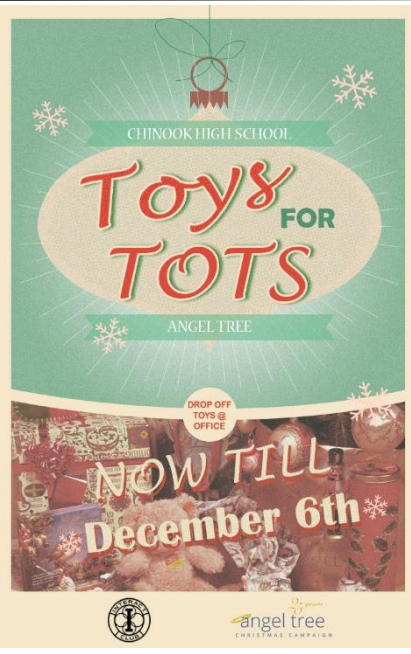
**Value:** \$1000
