Off-Campus Education Experiential Career Learning Opportunity, March 14th & 15, 2019 - This event is an opportunity for students to explore the trade they have a strong interest and aptitude in as a career. There will be four groups of trades for students to experience.

Automotive Group: Heavy Equipment Technician, Auto Body Technician, Auto Service Technician, Motorcycle mechanic, Recreation Vehicle Technician, Electrical Motor Technician
Welding/Metal Fabrication Group: Welder, Sheet Metal Worker, Machinist

Culinary Group: Cook, Baker

Construction Group: Cabinet maker, Carpenter, Plumber, Electrician, Flooring Installer, Concrete Finisher

Students will be placed with an employer, in their career choice, for two days of unpaid on the job experiential learning. The students will be expected to have all the employer required PPE and responsible for their own transportation to and from the workplace.

The expectations of the students:

Punctuality, respect for all safety rules and employer guidelines, and participation in all employer planned activities. All students will be covered under the Lethbridge School District worker's compensation policy and must have their parent or guardians consent forms completed. There are a limited number of student placements available; students must have a genuine interest and commitment to the trade, and be working toward the required trade entrance requirements.
