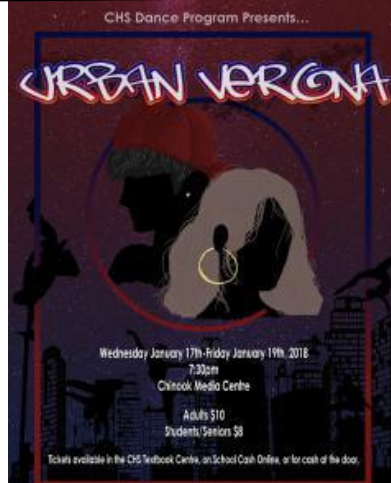
Textbook Centre

Eligibility Criteria:

- Be a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident and an Alberta resident (applicant's parent's must have resided in Alberta between July 1, 2017 & June 30, 2018)
- Be a grade 12 student who will have completed the requirements to graduate from high school by June 30th, 2018
- Be enrolled full-time in a post-secondary program in Canada, pursuing a degree in Accounting, Commerce or Business Management
- Submit a completed application form to Woodman White & Associates no later than **July 1st, 2018**

Selection Criteria: One student will be selected from all applicants to receive the award. The selection will be based on a combination of the following:

- Combined average final mark of English 30-1 or 30-2 and Math 30-1 and Math 30-2 (Preference will be given to those completing 30-1 courses).
- Submission of an essay (250 words maximum) responding to the question "Why ethics, honesty and integrity are essential characteristic of an Accountant".
- Completion of any BIT Financial Management Course/Projects or Practicums taken between grades 10 and 12
