## HAPPENING AT CHINOOK

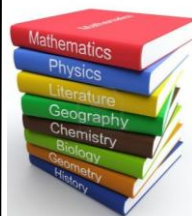

#### Selection Criteria:

- Excellent academic standing and leadership ability
- Community service, with an emphasis on non-school related volunteering
- Canadian citizen or landed immigrant between ages 16-18 (Students must be 16 before May 1, 2019).
- Write a short essay (approx. 250 words) or produce a 30-90 second creative video on "What does being a Canadian Citizen mean to you?"

Include your name, address, phone number, a list of your community service, your overall school academic average and the name and contact information of one reference that we can contact.

**Schulich Leader Scholarships** are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. Fifty are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Twenty-five are valued at \$100,000 for engineering scholarships and 25 are valued at \$80,000\* for science and math scholarships. You must be nominated by your school. Apply before **Feb 2, 2019**. **Off-Campus Education Experiential Career Learning Opportunity, March 14th & 15, 2019** - This event is an opportunity for students to explore the trade they have a strong interest and aptitude in as a career. Students will be placed with an employer, in their career choice, for two days of unpaid on the job experiential learning. The students will be expected to have all the employer required PPE and responsible for their own transportation to and from the workplace. The expectations of the students: Punctuality, respect for all safety rules and employer guidelines, and participation in all employer planned activities. There are a limited number of student placements available; students must have a genuine interest and commitment to the trade, and be working toward the required trade entrance requirements.
