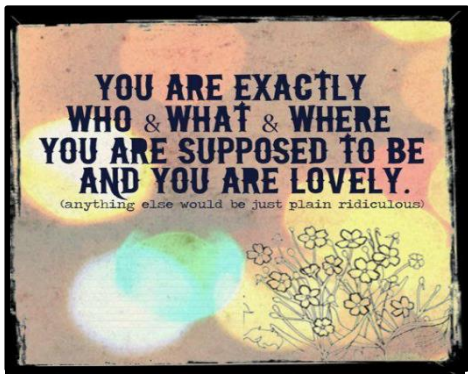

In 2017, the school district received \$2500 US (\$3000CAD) from ASBO International in recognition of Christine Lee receiving an ASBO International Eagle Award. How to Apply:

- 500 word essay, or
 - One page photo-essay that expresses the response visually, or

 - Artistic rendering (e.g. drawing) of your response

The cover letter (maximum of two pages please) should clearly state:

- Applicant's name
- Applicant's mailing address, email address & contact telephone number
- School graduating from
- Intended Post-secondary institution and program
- A summary of the applicant's volunteer service (at school and/or community)
- A brief explanation of why the field of study is being pursued
- Applications must also include:
- A summary of the applicant's high school marks (an unofficial transcript, which can be obtained from the school, is acceptable)
- One letter of recommendation (maximum of one page please) from a teacher or community member

All applicants will be contacted to confirm receipt of their application. The successful applicant will be notified by June 1, 2018 and the scholarship funds will be distributed directly to the post-secondary institution upon confirmation of enrolment.
